 - A. First 5 Napa Network
 - B. Quality Counts, E. Darlington
 - a. 2021-2022 training and resources are funded by HUB, this includes Anti-Bias Training Series, Oportunity for Providers for Teaching Pyramid Family Engagement Module, Pilot for CPIN (CA preschool instructional Network). There are upcoming events such as Anti Bias Training, Rainbow Kit Rollout, Deeper Dive Opportunities for Trauma Response/Resilience Circles, Design Team for Trauma Responsive Practices.

 - A. American Rescue Act funding for families/children, M. Grupe.
 - a. Community Leaders Collision met with county supervisors and discussed insights from community based organizations regarsing community needs. Request was made to supervisors to partner up to use the American rescue Plan funds. Discussed reimagining the childcare system to serve multiple purposes, housing, work opportunities and systematic change.

 - a. Discussed the 100k available to provide support to help landlords and tenants with rent-relief. Napa has lowest rate of access to funds and there's a need to get the word out regarding these funds and aid with technological drawbacks .

 - A. J. Gallgher, provided and update about the total slots available fro childcare/early care throughout the county and per Juan Cisnero there are a total of 257 slots in Napa with 60 children that have been accepted/enrolled. Also, NCOE had a 60% enrollement across the county and Napa and American Canyon have a higher enrollement rate as opposed to Calistoga and St. Helena.
 - B. D. Peralez- Expressed concerned about the enrollment rate which is below 24%. They need to test id poverty rate is nit aligned with Napa income treshhold and outreach in in place to help increase enrollement.
 - C. J. Occon Reports that the new state preschool in Calistoga is having the same issues in regards to enrollement. Wants to know if Napa County Health and Human Services can assit with sending out flyers to encourage enrollement among eligeable income households.
 - D. J. Gallagher-Jennifer Palmer will be resigning from position with F5N Commission.
