Here are a few resources to support these efforts:

Who was Martin Luther King Jr.? Martin Luther King Jr. was a civil rights leader and activist in the 1950s and 60s. He led marches and gave speeches to inspire others.

What is an activist? An activist is someone who speaks up for change. Anyone can be an activist and help make the world a better place!

What was the civil rights movement? People come in many shapes, colors, and sizes. We are all amazing! Throughout history, people have been treated unfairly because of the color of their skin, who they love, or because they moved here from a different country. In the 1960s, a lot of progress was made thanks to civil rights workers and leaders like Martin Luther King Jr. Today, people are still fighting to make things fairer for black, brown, and LGBTQ people.

What is social justice? Social justice is, in many ways, a combination of fairness and opportunity: In a just society or group, people have the same rights and are not punished more because of who they are, what color their skin is, or who they love.
